# Guide to Mentoring Programs in Aiken County

Successful education of Aiken County's children is crucial to the future vitality, economy, and overall well-being of our community. It affects us all. Unfortunately, many of our students drop out before graduating. In today's world, the lack of a high school diploma is a handicap that can be ill afforded. A key approach to improving this situation is through volunteer *mentors*. A mentor meets with a student once a week for at least an hour for one-on-one conversation.

Aiken County public schools identify elementary and middle school students who need help, who are in danger of dropping out of the system, and who may benefit from a mentor relationship. A mentor can be a role model. Often a mentor may be a person that a child otherwise might never meet. Mentors converse in an informal, friendly environment and seek to build self-esteem and encourage participation in class. Often students can't relate education to future success in life or have negatives in their lives that may hinder academic success. By talking, by listening, by relating, by just showing up when they say they will, mentors simply provide the opportunity to see the world differently. The opportunity is surely there to "touch a life."

What does it take to be a mentor? Dependability, patience, flexibility, and desire to contribute to a young person's success in life -- a young person you may never ever meet otherwise. (This is truly "Service above Self".) You don't need special training or skills. You don't send money. You simply share your experiences in life and you listen. Every member of our club can be a mentor. There is no cost, there are no meetings to go to, there is simply an hour of your time each week spent with a young person.
